WHAT ABOUT A VISIT TO NYMANS GARDENS?

The Crawley bus number 273 stops outside going both ways.

If you are not a member of the National Trust, there is a charge to go in. The pub opposite does a good lunch at a reasonable price.

VISIT CHICHESTER AND THE HARBOUR

This is well worth a visit and there is plenty to see and do. From Chichester Bus Station the number 56 will take you to BOSHAM, a lovely village close to the Harbour; Bus 52 & 53 will take you to the Harbour and the Marina Village where you can take a boat tour of the Harbour and surrounding area.

OR you could stay on the 700 and go to Emsworth which is a Village on the Harbour estuary, well worth a visit.

Chichester also has the South Downs Planetarium but you need to phone [01243 774400] for opening times.

For those of you who enjoy visiting FARMERS MARKETS there is two a month in the centre of Chichester 1st & 3rd Friday of each month 9,00am – 2,00pm.

CLOSER TO HOME

WHY NOT GO EAST?

From Eastbourne you can go all the way to DOVER, if you have the stamina, but Bexhill, Hastings and Rye are within reach. When you alight at the ARNDALE CENTRE stay at the same bus stop and wait for the 99/ 711/712. RYE has a market day on Tuesdays I have made this trip and it is a lovely day out. Rye is beautiful, very old world, a little on the hilly side but well worth it. It also has an in door market and excellent café's and restaurants, particularly Fish and Chips.

If you go to BEXHILL, have tea at the De La Warr pavilion it is a must. The seafront is clean, tidy and very easily walkable. The town itself is not overloaded with shops but there are plenty of restaurants to suit all palates and prices.

HASTINGS is more geared to younger people, the Pier is nice, the shops are more plentiful, rather like Brighton. However, the FUNICULAR RAILWAY from the seafront to the 1066 site on the downs is a worthwhile trip.

A visit to Eastbourne's Sovereign Harbour is well worth it. There are shops, a cinema, even an ASDA. You walk through shopping square to the Harbour itself where you will find numerous restaurants at reasonable prices right on the harbour side.

Wonderful on a hot sunny day.

You can get the number 5 bus from the Arndale Centre [Shelter.A] On the hour and half hour.
